Message from the President



The Japan Institute of International Affairs (JIIA), now celebrating its 50th anniversary, is a private, nonpartisan policy think-tank focused on foreign and security policy issues. On top of a wide range of research programs, the institute promotes dialogues and joint studies with other institutions and experts at home and abroad, examines Japanese foreign policy and makes proposals to the government, and disseminates information on international relations to the public.

In 1959, former Prime Minister Shigeru Yoshida founded the Japan Institute of International Affairs to deepen Japan's knowledge of world affairs and to bolster the foreign relations of a democratic Japan. In this effort, he garnered the support of key members of parliament, luminaries including the foreign minister, president of the Bank of Japan, chairman of the Japan Federation of Economic Organizations, as well as leading figures of the academy and media. As Prime Minister, Yoshida steered Japan through the post-1945 democratic transformation, stepping down from office in 1954. Yoshida then served as the first chairman of the institute. In 1960, the institute received accreditation as an independent foundation from the Japanese Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

The institute, together with a large network of affiliated scholars, aims to serve as an indispensable resource related to international affairs in a complex world. I have been privileged to lead the institute as its president and look forward to further involvement with this outward-looking think-tank.

Center for the Promotion of Disarmament Non-Proliferation (CPDNP)

CPDNP is a research center dedicated to supporting Japan's disarmament and non-proliferation policy. The current research emphasis is nuclear disarmament. The Center acts as the secretariat of the National Operation System for the Comprehensive Nuclear Test-Ban Treaty (CTBT) and supervises the construction and operation of ten monitoring stations in Japan that are part of the CTBT verification regime.

Council for Security Cooperation in the Asia Pacific (CSCAP-JAPAN)

The Japan Institute of International Affairs along with nine other international policy and research institutes established CSCAP in 1993 in Kuala Lumpur. CSCAP is a non-governmental "Track II" process for multilateral security dialogue in the Asia-Pacific. Membership has expanded and today includes institutes representing Australia, Brunei, Cambodia, Canada, China, the European Union, India, Indonesia, Japan, North Korea, South Korea, Malaysia, Mongolia, New Guinea, New Zealand, the Philippines, Russia, Singapore, Thailand, the United States and Vietnam. CSCAP often addresses issues that are too sensitive for official dialogue, and supports and complements the efforts of governmental "Track I" multilateral dialogue mechanisms such as the ASEAN Regional Forum (ARF). The Japan Institute of International Affairs serves as the secretariat of the Japan National Committee for Pacific Economic Cooperation (JANCPEC). Founded in 1980 at the initiative of Masayoshi Ohira and Malcolm Fraser, then prime ministers of Japan and Australia, the Pacific Economic Cooperation Council is an independent and unofficial regional mechanism to advance economic cooperation and market-driven integration. PECC is a unique partnership of business, government and intellectual leaders engaged in their private capacities to promote economic growth, social progress, scientific and technological development, and environmental conservation. PECC has twenty-three full Member Committees and one Associate Member from economies in the Pacific region.
