Strong ASEAN Support

- Four TPP members are also ASEAN members: Brunei, Malaysia, Singapore and Vietnam
- All four have repeatedly urged Japan to get in
 - Wanted Japan in sooner, but will take it now
- Benefits:
 - Economic payoffs for TPP overall
 - Linkages to Japan's value chains critical for ASEAN
 - Unexpressed interest: Japan as counterweight to US in negotiations
- But, in general, TPP likely to pull ASEAN members in different directions

Less Enthusiastic Australia/New Zealand Support

- Australia and New Zealand grant economic benefits arguments of Japan in agreement, but worried about...
- Problems concluding bilateral deal with Aus
- Issues of agriculture loom large
- Risks of delay (and possible collapse) are seen as significant
- Reluctance to get caught in middle of US-J
- Unexpressed: J dilutes their position in TPP

TPP Vs. RCEP

- Is a sense in some in Asia that TPP not so necessary with RCEP coming up
- RCEP much less ambitious—easier to carve out sensitivities for everyone
- But, agreement with lots of exceptions will deliver few economic benefits to many
- Political problems likely in RCEP negotiations
- Pull between TPP and non-TPP members in RCEP
