# GUIDELINES

#### 1. Purpose

The Program awards fellowships by invitation to young scholars and analysts to conduct advanced research at JIIA.

#### 2. Prospective Applicants

Scholars or researchers in the fields of international relations, international politics and economics, security, area studies and/or journalism who work in institutes, think tanks, or universities and Ph D Candidates pursuing research in the fields of international relations, international politics and economics, security, area studies and/or journalism

#### 3. Duration

Up to three months (from November 1, 2014, to March 31, 2015)

## 4. Eligibility

- (1) We will invite two fellows from the Republic of Korea (ROK).
- (2) Applicants must be scholars or researchers in the fields of international relations, international politics and economy, security, area studies and/or journalism, and be at least Master's degree holders or PhD candidates
- (3) Applicants must be no more than 45 years of age.
- (4) Persons who have previously received a JIIA Fellowship or who presently reside in Japan are <u>not</u> eligible.
- (5) Applicants who are currently employed should get a Leave of Absence from the work place
- (6) Applicants should have the ability to write their reports in English or Japanese.
- (7) Applicants must be in good health.
- (8) In principle, applicants must be able to stay continuously in Japan during the term of the fellowship.

#### 5. Research Topics

Fellows will be expected to conduct research activities at JIIA on topics within JIIA's purview, such as foreign policy, international politics or economics.

# 6. Application

- A. Applicants should submit the following documents to JIIA in either English or Japanese by air mail no later than September 30, 2014. <u>Applications sent by e-mail will not be accepted.</u>

- (2) Curriculum vitae
- (3) <u>Prospective research proposal:</u> the proposal should outline the applicant's intended research at JIIA in a maximum of 5 pages, typewritten and double-spaced
- (4) <u>List of previous achievements</u> (including topics and dates of research papers and the names of publications or journals)
- (5) <u>One recommendation letter</u>, addressed to President, JIIA
- (6) Applicants who are employed: Certification of employment
- (7) Applicants who are Ph D Candidates: Certification of enrollment of University
- (8) Copy of diploma (certification of the highest level of education reached, not a transcript of your grades)
- (9) Three photos (40 mm x 30 mm); one should be attached to the front page of the Application Form
- **B.** Note that applications and attached documents, including recommendation letters, will not be returned. Applications arriving after the deadline will be invalid.

## . Notification

The results of screening will be announced only to applicants <u>within October, 2014</u>. JIIA cannot discuss the status of any application during the screening process.

## 9. Instructions for Submitting Documentation

- (1) All documentation must be typewritten and double-spaced, and must be submitted on <u>A4-size paper (210mm x 297mm)</u>. JIIA does not need to receive the original books/journals.
- (2) Applications cannot be submitted by e-mail or fax; we recommend you submit them by air mail using FedEx, DHL, or EMS.
- (3) Documentation should **not** be bound or stapled together.
- (4) Page numbers should be placed on each page.
- (5) <u>The recommendation letters should be sent together with the application form.</u> Please note that JIIA does not inform recommenders of the screening results.

## 10. Financial Support

Airfare (Y class), a settling-in allowance, and monthly benefits will be paid by JIIA. Applicants will be informed of the details in due course.

# 11. Obligations

- (1) Fellows are to offer interim and final presentations on their papers and to submit final report papers to JIIA.
- (2) Fellows interviewed by the media or otherwise offering statements to the press during the term of their fellowships are required as a general rule to specify that they are in Japan on a Japan-Korea Dialogue Fellowship.

# 12. Basic Terms and Conditions

- (1) The Fellowship is tenable only in Japan. Fellows must reside in Japan continuously during the term of the fellowship.
- (2) Fellows may not hold another major grant concurrently with the Japan-Korea Dialogue Fellowship. Those who have applied successfully for another award for the same proposal will be required to choose one grant. If a candidate is offered any other grant whose term overlaps with that of the Japan-Korea Dialogue Fellowship, he/she must decline either the Japan-Korea Dialogue Fellowship or the other grant(s) for the overlapping period.
- (3) Fellows should consult with JIIA on the timing of the start of their fellowships.
- (4) Fellows may not accept any employment in Japan during the term of their awards, with or without remuneration.
- (5) Candidates selected as Fellows will be required to submit a medical certificate before arriving in Japan. The cost of the medical check-up will be borne by the fellowship recipient.
- (6) JIIA provides Fellows with a cubicle (about 1.5 m x 1.5 m) having a desk, a domestic-use telephone and a personal computer connected to the Internet.
- (7) Fellows will hold the title of Visiting Research Fellow at JIIA (non-diplomatic status) during the period of their fellowships and will be able to attend JIIA open conferences and symposia.
- (8) JIIA may ask Fellows to cooperate in JIIA activities, e.g., serve as a presenter at a JIIA Forum, participate in conferences hosted by JIIA, or write an article for JIIA Commentary.
